### MVMS ATHLETIC EVENT INFORMATION

Parents, we appreciate your cooperation during MVMS Athletic Events. We are so very proud and excited to launch fall sports and see the student athletes playing games. And we want to keep it that way. Again, your cooperation is essential, as we want to keep all athletes and attendees safe and healthy.

Please read below on the following guidelines for guests at MVMS Athletic Events.

**MVMS SOCCER GAMES:** 3 tickets, per athlete, may be purchased for MVMS soccer games. X's are marked in the bleachers and along the sidelines, indicating available seats. Bleacher space is minimal, and lawn chairs are recommended. Spectators from the first contest must clear out immediately to allow room for the spectators of the second contest. Siblings **MUST** remain seated with parents.

**MVMS FOOTBALL GAMES:** 250 tickets will be available for MVMS football games. 2 adult tickets per player/cheerleader may be purchased. Siblings may attend if capacity is not met, and Siblings **MUST** remain seated with parents.

**MVMS VOLLEYBALL MATCHES:** 3 tickets, per athlete, may be purchased for MVMS volleyball matches. X's are marked in the bleachers, indicating available seats. Spectators from the 7th-grade match must clear out immediately to allow room for the spectators of the 8th-grade match. Siblings **MUST** remain seated with parents.

MVMS will honor **NO** passes this year. All persons entering MVMS sporting events must have a ticket. Tickets will be available at the gate for \$4.00.

Guests to MVMS Athletic events will be required to wear a mask at all times when not seated, and to maintain social distancing of 6 ft or more, outside of their household unit.

**Student Handbook Guidelines for Mask Compliance** - Noncompliance with Safety and Health Procedures. Upon **first offense**, the student will be given a warning, and will be reinstructed by the teacher or staff member/administration regarding safety policy and regulations and a phone call will be made to a parent/guardian documenting the warning. A **second offense** will result in parent/guardian contact by a school administrator notifying the parent/guardian that the next offense will result in the student being designated as a virtual learner. A **third offense** shall be documented and the parent/guardian will be notified of the student being designated as a virtual learner and excluded from in-person enrollment at school for all curricular, extra-curricular, and co-curricular activities.

### **Short Term E-Learning**

Parents, if you have a student that has been asked by school Health Officials to be quarantined for a certain number of days please be sure your student is completing their classroom assignments. This short term e-learning should occur by having your student check email, google classroom, and canvas daily. Teachers will utilize these three platforms to communicate student work. It would also be helpful to have your student reach out to their teachers via email.

### **What Communication to Expect with COVID-19 Cases**

Based on recent COVID-19 cases in other school districts, the Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation is preparing for positive cases in our school buildings. MVCSC has developed many protocols to provide a safe and healthy learning environment for students and staff. Staff and parents/guardians should also be prepared for students and staff to not be in attendance, possibly for a period of time.

As of August 13, our plans for when Mt. Vernon has a case of COVID-19 include:

- Each positive case of COVID-19 or COVID-19 exposure will be addressed individually.
- Parents/guardians will receive a phone call, and/or notification from the school via ParentSquare if their child was in close contact and needs to be quarantined or is affected by the case in any way. The Indiana State Department of Health may text from 877-548-3444 or call from 833-670-0067 (displayed as “IN Health COVID”); parents/guardians are encouraged to answer calls/texts from these numbers and MVCSC.
- Parents/guardians will not receive notice if there is a COVID-19 case in their school unless it reaches the level that the school must be closed.
- The media may end up reporting on positive cases if they inquire, but they will not receive any additional details other than the number and a generalized statement.
- We ask the community to NOT make efforts to figure out who the positive case is. If you happen to learn of a positive case from someone else, you should not share that information with others.
- At times, the parent/guardian phone call may have to identify a cohort of students that is being quarantined. We ask parents/guardians and staff to keep this information to yourself and not share it with others. We are asking you to respect the privacy of others in our community who are going through a stressful time.
- Staff who need to know if a student or staff member will be absent will receive this information from their principal/supervisor. This private information is a need-to-know basis.

When COVID-19 positive cases impact our schools, rest assured that we are cognizant of the balance between the needs of all of our families and staff members and the confidentiality we need to provide through FERPA to the infected/potentially infected individual(s). Please be comforted in knowing that when someone is not at school, it could be for a myriad of reasons, and most of those are private. We have developed a system of contact tracing that is robust and detailed to ensure those who need to know will receive information and directions very quickly.

Our community has a history of rallying around the needs of our schools and we are working diligently to provide the best opportunity to keep schools in session for as long as we can. Working together by communicating well and self-screening children on a daily basis (keeping them home if they exhibit a symptom of COVID-19) is essential. Our shared efforts to ensure that we are doing our part in mitigating the spread of COVID-19, as well as maintaining a positive learning environment for our students and staff, is key to meeting the needs of our students during this historic time.

Thank you for your support and understanding. We are prepared to provide a wonderful experience for our students and look forward to supporting their learning and emotional needs as we begin the 2020-2021 school year.
